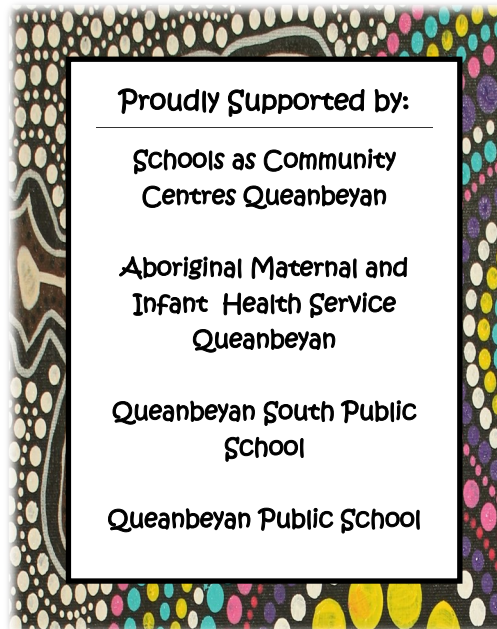


What's Involved?

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Why Early Literacy?

Reading, rhyming, singing and talking — beginning from birth — really strongly influences literacy and language development, the foundation for all other learning.

It is also a really wonderful way to enjoy time together with your baby.

Early literacy development is about everyday, fun activities like singing, talking and playing games.

Key points

- Literacy development is learning about sounds, words and language. Literacy is the basis for your child's ability to read, write, communicate and socialise.
- You can develop your child's early literacy by communicating with your child, reading, and playing with rhyme.
